Caol & Lochyside Flood Prevention Scheme (CALFPS)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Highland Council continues to defend areas at risk from flood damage and coastal erosion. Where Loch Eil meets Loch Linnhe in Scotland lies the small village of Caol, where RJ McLeod (Contractors) Ltd has been working under the shadow of Ben Nevis, helping to ensure the future safety of the village from flooding and water damage.

HATCRETE has contributed to this flood alleviation scheme by supplying coloured and decorative concrete products, helping RJ McLeod create something the local community can be proud of. The pattern imprinted into the concrete wall by RJ McLeod is complemented by HATCRETE Smokestone Colourmix, used to integrally colour the concrete and help blend the wall into its beautiful natural surroundings.

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

To supply 780m³ of HATCRETE Smokestone Colourmix to the Leiths plant, which provided the concrete for RJ McLeod's integrally coloured flood defence wall.
