Stockwell Skatepark, London

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

One of the oldest skateparks in London or, for that matter, anywhere Stockwell Skatepark, also known as “Brixton Beach” or “Brixton Bowls”, was built in 1978. It is overseen by the Friends of Stockwell Skatepark and was originally constructed by Lorne Edwards, who also built the UK’s first skatepark in Portland, Dorset.

The new concrete finishing work, which incorporates HATCRETE Stanton Red Colourmix, was supplied by Capital Concrete and carried out by Betongpark, one of Europe’s leading skatepark design and construction firms.
